NATIVE JUSTICE REVISITED:

On the Making of the UCLA Guam Travel Study Program

What is Native justice? How does one theorize, debate, and practice just relations with Native people and the wider public? And how might students and teachers alike support such endeavors? Keith Camacho will address these questions by exploring the making of the UCLA Guam Travel Study Program. He will discuss the ways in which the indigenous Chamorro concepts of mamåhlao (humility), chenchule' (reciprocity), and inafa'moalek (group harmony) informed the program's academic curricula, community partnerships, and public-facing activities. Keith L. Camacho is Professor of Asian American Studies at the University of California, Los Angeles.
